Dear Chairman Cole and Ranking Member DeLauro,

I am requesting funding for the Central Brooklyn Violence Prevention Collaborative in fiscal year 2025. The entity to receive funding for this project is the Research Foundation of CUNY on behalf of the John Jay College of Criminal Justice, located at 230 W 31st Street, New York, New York, 10036. The funding would be used to hire additional staff for their current programming and to place staff to provide technical assistance to local violence prevention groups. Funding will also be used for costs to host collaborative meetings to address cases of individuals in crisis and other administrative costs for the program. The project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because it will help to identify at risk individuals in the community who are likely to commit violent crimes and engage them in preventative support services in consultation with local law enforcement.
